**OFFICE MEMORANDUM**

**Subject: Annual Data Updation on IMIS regarding**

As per the National Rural Drinking Water Programme guideline, the online monitoring system - Integrated Management Information System (IMIS) Ver. 2.0 has come into force with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2009. All states had been requested to complete the 'Data Realignment' exercise to indicate the status of coverage of population against each habitation. Along with this the 'Annual Project Shelf' and 'Target Habitations for 2009-2010', were also entered by the states. The annual data for year ending 2009-2010 will be automatically taken from this data after taking into account the physical and financial progress.

As the first year of implementation of the Online Information System is nearing completion, a few data gaps have been observed.


1. The states have indicated the status of coverage of population with safe and adequate drinking water at convenient location. This information is available in the enclosed report. It has been observed that a large number of habitations have been marked under the 'zero population' covered category. It is understood that such habitations have public or private sources/ water supply systems, which have not been provided by the state government and are owned and maintained by the community, panchayat, individuals or other agencies. Such habitations have to be marked under the '100% population covered' category. It may be noted that only those habitations, in which the population is consuming water from unsafe, unprotected, unhygienic sources and there is not a single source of potable water, should be marked under the 'zero population covered' category. A clarification in this regard, for the data entered by your state, may be provided by 20/01/2010, after which the data correction would be enabled on the IMIS site.
2. The average lpcd for all habitations other than the habitations with 100% population coverage will have to be updated. Also, information on availability of minimum 10 lpcd of

safe and potable drinking water within 500 metres in plains and 50 metres elevation in hills will have to be entered.

3. Water Quality Laboratory test results for all habitations marked as quality affected, as on 01/04/09, must be entered on priority now.
4. All Sub-Mission scheme information, sanctioned from 2004-05 onwards should be entered, on priority.

The data mentioned above may be updated on the IMIS system at the earliest. The last date for this updation is 15<sup>th</sup> February, 2010. For any technical queries, you may please contact the NIC cell at our office.

A meeting of the IMIS nodal persons and one field engineer from each state will be held early next month, for discussing the next course of action and reviewing the progress of data updation. Details of agenda and venue will be intimated in a separate letter to all state governments. This is for your kind information.
